Persecution, war, political instability and displacement are all factors that lead individuals and families to leave their homes to seek permanent protection elsewhere, including Australia.

Refugees who come to Australia face many challenges on settlement such as financial hardship, dealing with experiences of torture and trauma, and family separation – yet Australia is a nation built on immigration.

We have a long history of providing safe asylum to refugees, many of whom have gone on to make great civil, social and economic contributions to Australian society.

as members of the Australian community. SSI provides support and assistance to the majority of people in NSW on refugee and bridging visas. The organisation values difference and the right to self-determination for the people we support, as well as meaningful social and economic inclusion in Australian society.

The latest figures available show that the number of refugees of concern to UNHCR in mid-2015 reached an estimated 15.1 million refugees – the highest level in 20 years¹, and in mid-2014 there were more than 1.2 million asylum-seekers².

spread the word

Promote your fundraiser any way you can and as early as you can. Tell everyone you know what you're doing and ask them to tell everyone they know. This will help to give your fundraiser some momentum.

Promote on social media sites such as Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and LinkedIn by sharing your everydayhero fundraising link. Contact local businesses for support by sticking up posters or flyers.

Send news about your fundraiser to your networks via email. An incentive could be reminding them that any donations of \$2 and over are tax deductible.

Fundraising support

Before you start your fundraiser, you must have an *Authority to Fundraise* letter, which is automated through your registration process.

To help with your fundraiser, here is what support the SSI fundraising team can offer.

We can:

- provide advice to help you plan your fundraising activity.
- provide tax deductible receipts for donations of \$2 or more.
- provide you with official SSI promotional material such as a customisable poster.
- supply approved wording for communicating with your audience about our work.
- allow you to use our brand name in the promotion of your fundraiser to indicate where your raised funds will be donated. However, you are not able to use our name as part of the fundraiser.
 For example you MAY use 'Proudly Supporting Settlement Services International'.
 but you may NOT use 'Settlement Services

International's Trivia Night'.

We cannot:

- advise or help you clarify the relevant legislation for your fundraising activity (particularly raffles and competitions). It is best that you refer to your local state or territory authority. Please refer to the Australian Taxation Office for tax advice.
- undertake tasks for you in the running of the fundraiser (source prizes, sponsorship, publicity, staff resources, goods or services, promote etc.) as we do not have resources.
- provide public liability insurance cover for community fundraising activities as there is no way for us to assess and manage the risks of all these activities (we strongly recommend you organise public liability insurance).
- provide tax advice (we recommend contacting the Australian Taxation Office).
- allow you to produce any unofficial merchandise bearing the name or logo of Settlement Services International.
