Purpose:

The SSI employment and enterprise team provides employment support to refugees and asylum seekers through both the Refugee Employment Support Program and the Careers Pathways Pilot programs, helping clients to develop a career plan to achieve their employment goals. Employment mentors will support the employment team by guiding clients who are seeking employment in areas that are the same or similar to each mentor's own professional background.

Mentors will add significant value to refugees' job seeking efforts by offering insight into industry job markets, targeted job application strategies and workplace culture. Where appropriate, mentors will also look to introduce job seekers to professional networks and contacts. By engaging with job seekers on a one-on-one basis employment mentors will assist refugees to develop specific skills, knowledge and confidence to gain employment in the industry of their choice.

Specific duties and responsibilities:

- Support participants to achieve their employment goals by developing strategies to pursue employment in their chosen profession
- Provide guidance and support in relation to Australian work life, rights and culture in participants industry of choice
- Provide information about professional and educational requirements for specific professions
- Support participants to develop industry specific language and communication skills



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- Connect participants to industry contacts
- Support participants to develop inter-cultural competencies for the Australian workplace including developing English language and communication skills
- Work with participants to develop skills and strategies to maintain employment.
- Coach participant to develop problem solving skills for the workplace
- Assist participants to build life, industry and employment related connections. Maintain regular contact with participants and the employment team
- Actively support SSI's vision and values
- Work in accordance with SSI policies and procedures
- Follow all reasonable directions provided by the employment team
