How you can help

This toolkit is for organisations and individuals working with multicultural communities across Australia. It has been prepared to help you promote our free training for community and faith leaders to learn how to safely support people experiencing family, domestic, and sexual violence in their community.

We are seeking your support to ensure this training reaches those leaders who will benefit most from the learning resources.

The e-learning module is called Taking action to keep multicultural communities safe: Faith and community leaders training.

Frequently asked questions (FAQs)

These FAQs provide you with relevant information to be able to talk to stakeholders, including faith and community leaders, about the Train, Engage, Connect and Support (TECS) project and training package.

Q1:

What is the project about and who are the training resources for?

The project provides culturally responsive training and community resources to equip faith and community leaders with the knowledge, tools, and language to support people experiencing family, domestic and sexual violence (FDSV), particularly in multicultural contexts.

Q2: What is included in the training?

The training includes:

- Taking Action to Keep Multicultural Communities Safe: an interactive. online learning course for community and faith leaders. It includes vignettes - short videos featuring local faith and community leaders.
- A Conversation Guide to help leaders recall important information from the e-learning and to support with having conversations about FDSV.
- Reflection pieces and downloadable resources.
- Suggestions regarding how and where to access further information.
- Certificates of completion.

Faith and community leaders training

Q3: How long does it take to complete the training?

The e-learning takes about 3 hours to complete.

- It includes 9 interactive lessons, which take approximately 20-30 minutes each.
- It is self-paced, allowing learners to pause at any time and resume their progress from where they left off.

Q4: Why should faith and community leaders do the training?

- It's flexible online, self-paced and accessible anywhere.
- It's practical includes videos, real-world examples, and useful tips and guides.
- It's tailored to you made specifically for multicultural and faith-based communities in Australia. designed alongside multicultural community leaders, faith leaders, service providers and people with lived experience of FDSV.
- It's free no cost training, with certificates available on completion.

Q5: What will leaders learn in the training?

The training aims to increase faith and community leaders' confidence in:

- Understanding your role in preventing and responding to family, domestic and sexual violence (FDSV)
- How to recognise signs of FDSV
- Ways to respond with compassion, respect and safety
- How to refer to culturally appropriate services
- Where you can get support from specialist services
- Skills to lead open, supportive conversations in your community

Q6: Are these resources free to use?

Yes, all TECS resources are freely available and designed for wide community distribution.

Q7: How is this training package different from other FDSV resources in Australia?

TECS resources:

- were developed through national consultations, followed by a comprehensive co-design process with multicultural faith and community leaders, service providers and people with lived experience of FDSV. This ensures the resources meet the needs of faith and community leaders.
- use inclusive and non-judgmental language, focusing on cultural responsiveness and empowerment, not blame or fear.
- offer both training modules and practical tools for real-life conversations within communities.
- are nationally consistent, and culturally responsive.

Q8:

What if leaders want to learn more after completing the training?

The resources are designed to support leaders who have limited experience or would like to build their confidence in safely and appropriately preventing and responding to FDSV in their community.

For leaders who want to stay engaged or who are seeking deeper understanding after completing the e-module, we encourage:

- Participation in a TECS learning circle to connect with other leaders who have also completed the training, and to collaboratively share learnings and knowledge. Registration is available within the e-learning.
- Enrolment in the DV-alert training program. This free course offers an opportunity for more comprehensive learning and formal certification. Visit dvalert.org.au

Q9: Is the training package translated into other languages?

The Conversation Guide will soon be available in 8-10 community languages. We will advise when these versions are available.

At this stage, the e-learning module is only available in English. However, we are collecting data to inform project funders regarding translation needs and the impacts on accessibility, and would welcome your feedback.
